QC CELEBRATING NATIONAL PRIDE MONTH

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE - How to register

Go to: <https://publicschoolsbranch.schoolcashionline.com/> and click Register. Enter your first name, last name, email address, and create a password. Select a security question, select yes to receive email notifications (note that you will not receive any promotional emails) You will receive a confirmation via email. Check your Spam folder if you don't receive it. Use your email address and password to log in to your account. Once you are logged in to your account, navigate to “My Account” from the dropdown menu, select “My Students” and click to add a child. Type your school board name, then choose your school from the list. Enter your child's details and click confirm.
